Item I will that my funerals Charges and all those
Debts and Duties which I owe in right of Conscience to any
manner of Person or persons whatsoever, be with allow-
convenience paid fully, contented and paid by my Execu-
tors hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath unto my son
Thomas one Young Horse named Jolly boy, and one Grey one
Cattleshoe and one Cullash, and the best Mare that
shall be folded from one of the Mares which I give to my son
Joseph or my son Benjamin, he and her Increase to him the
said Thomas Turner his Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel, one Young
one Cullash boy and one Cullash, and one Mare named Joan,
her and her Increase to him the said Samuel Turner his
Heirs and Assigns for ever. Item I give and
bequeath unto my son Joseph, one Grey Mare named Bonny
but and her increase to him the said Joseph Turner, his
Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin one
Mare named Bridget, her and her Increase, to him the said
Benjamin Turner, his Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Eliz. one Mare
Colt named Jenny, her and her Increase, with eight Cows and
Eight Calves, and one hundred pounds Current money of this
Province, to be paid her the said Elizabeth Turner, do the age
of sixteen or Marriage, it being in full of all her portion, to her
and her Heirs and Assigns for ever.

Item my Will is that out of my Estate that is not yet
disposed of, my wellbeloved Wife shall have her maintenance
Dowrying Excepted, for which Forty pounds every Year Current
money of this Province to be paid her on the first day of
the month of January commencing from the Day of my Death, during her
Natural Life, and in case she marry, then to be paid fifty pounds
in full of all, and in case she never marry then the afore-
mentioned shall be answered by my sons dowering her
Natural Life.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Sons afore menti-
oned, all the rest of my Estate Real and Personal to be
Equally Divided, Shared and Shared alike to them and their
Heirs and Assigns for ever, they Equally allowing for the
Seducing of the Younger Children, as their Mothers shall think
fit. Item my Will is that if either of them should die afore-
marriage or division be made, which Division is when Joseph
comes to the age of Eighteen, then there shall be an Equal
Share, among the rest of my Sons, and in case either of them
should prove undutiful to their Mother, that then the said
said Elizabeth Turner shall cut them off as she shall think
fit. Lastly, I nominate, constitute and appoint my Dear
