two aforesaid Sons, and one Thousand Acres of Land lying

Acres of Land lying near Port Royal. Also I give and bequeath

and his heirs for ever over and above what I have already
given him my two Lots of Land lying near and without

Slaves whose names are Viz^y Jenny, Kate, Pappan, Florida,
