Whereas Thomas Godfrey, late of Bucks County in this Province deceased, lately died intestate, having while he lived, and at the time of his death, been a free, right and credit within this Province aforesaid, by means whereof the full disposition and power of granting these administrations of sale and singular in, sales, rights and credits of the said Thomas Godfrey deceased, and also the auditing of the said, calculations and reckonings of the aforesaid Administration, and a final dismissal of the same is manifestly known to belong, Desiring that the said goods, rights & credits which were of the said deceased may be well and truly administered.

The last Will of Mr. W^m Livingston.

In the name of God Amen.

I William Livingston late of Charles City near of New York River being independent of body, but of perfect & sound mind, thanks be to God, do make & conclude this my my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. I do commend my immortal Soul to God y^r Father, in & thro' y^r mercy & intercession of his Son, Jesus Christ my God & Redeemer in whom I hope to live for ever, after the resurrection of this body w^{ch} I do desire may be interred in Charles City w^{ch} as beeth accustomed may be by my late Wife Ann, w^{ch} I do appoint not out of any dissimulation to my private Wife, but for y^r sake of a pious promise, after all my just debts are paid, I give, devise and bequeath unto my eldest Son William half of y^r Tract of Land contained in three Plots, w^{ch} I bought of John Rannaway near Fortson River making 1006 Acres, and he may have his choice of y^r ^{Acres} ^{to} ^{be} ^{made} ^{up} ^{of} ^{the} ^{same} ^{land} to him & his heirs for ever, & y^r other moiety I give to my second Son Henry & his heirs for ever.

II I give, devise & bequeath all that part of the four thousand Acres of Land I bought of Col^l. Daniel, & w^{ch} I did not part with to my first Wife, making together with my part of what I sold her, two thousand two hundred & fifty Acres, to be equally divided between my beloved Wife Hannah, & my son William, Henry, & daughter Margaret, only my son William may have the dividend the ^{whole} ^{land} ^{falls} ^{upon} if he pleases to them & their heirs for ever.

III I give, bequeath & devise unto my Son Thomas the Plantation called "Wheatfield," (which was his Mother's) with all the adjacent Lands I purchased making in all about ^{about} ^{four} ^{thousand} ^{acres} ^{or} ^{there} ^{abouts} ⁱⁿ ^{Charles} ^{City} upon the white point (purchased by Mrs. Bolton) to him & his heirs for ever.

IV I give, devise & bequeath unto Henry & William Livingston, (sons of Bro^r. John Livingston, for Thomas) Acres of Swamp in y^r other side of my Son River, run out in Col^l. Daniel's time by John, Trapp, to them & their heirs for ever.

V I give, devise and bequeath unto my youngest Son George the lands bought of Stephen Bidon, David, & John, Fisher making in all about fifteen hundred Acres, & situate on Port Royal River, to him & his heirs for ever, item & in like manner, I give unto him my said Son George that lot of Land I have lying behind John Toper's in Charles City & I am my said Son have in my new London. I give to my son William and his heirs for ever.

VI My beloved Wife may live upon the Plantation, where she now dwells, taking her Widowhood, but upon her marrying, to which I sincerely advise her, I order the Plantation to be sold by my Executors hereafter named, who hereby have full power for that purpose, or when my son William shall come to the age of Twenty Years, which shall first happen. What Rings and Jewels I have, I give to my beloved Wife, to be disposed of amongst my Children at her discretion. All my Personal Estate I give to my beloved Wife Hannah & my five Children to be equally divided amongst them, and the management of it I leave to the discretion of my Executors.
