In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Grimbals of Edisto
Island in Colleton County and Province of South Carolina, Planter being
Sick and weak of Body but of Sound and perfect mind and memory Blessed
be God for the same, and calling to mind the uncertainty and Instability of
Humanity's Life, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament
In manner and form following That is to say First and principally I
will and bequeath my Soul to God who gave it me, hoping through his
Mercy and the Merits of my Blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to
obtain free remission and pardon for all my sins, and my Body I commit
to the Earth from whence it was Taken to be decently Buried And as for
what worldly Estate the Lord has been pleased in Mercy to Endow me
with I give and dispose thereof as followeth. First I give and
bequeath unto my Loving wife Sarah Grimbals a negro Woman named
Daphny During the Natural Life of my said Wife, I reserved my said
Wife should Marry then my Will and pleasure is that the said Negro be
free and no longer a Slave to any Person, But only during the Widowhood
of my said Wife and no longer. Item I will and bequeath unto my
aforesaid Loving Wife Sarah Grimbals the use of my Plantation
whereon I now live with free Egress and Regress without Impairment
of or for any manner of Way by any person or persons what soever for
and during the term of her Widowhood and no longer And further
my Will and pleasure is that Immediately after my decease, that all my
Lawful Debts be paid or as soon as possibly my Executors Can
and

And then that all my Personall Estate rights and Credits be divided into three equal parts by four Sufficient Men of known reputation, and four Justly Lives to be Indifferently chosen by my Executors here for Nomination, and when my Estate is so divided as aforesaid I Will and Bequeath One full third part thereof unto my Loving Wife Sarah Grimball for and During the Term of her naturall Life: Always providing howethels that it is my Will and meaning that she shall immediately upon her Receiving the aforesaid Third part of my Estate bring the same to appraisment, and Give in Good and Sufficient Security to receive the true value thereof when appraised, at the time of her decease, to my Son Paul Grimball, which sum whatsoever it may be I will and Bequeath to be Equally Divided Among my four Sons, viz: Paul, Thomas, Joshu and Isaac Grimball their or Either of their Surviving heirs, And further in Case my said Son Paul Grimball should die before my said Loving Wife Sarah Grimball I hereby will and Invest his equal portion, In my Surviving Children In and about the premises.

Item, I will and Bequeath the other Two Third Parts of all my Personall Estate to be Equally divided among my four Loving Sons viz: Paul, Thomas, Joshu and Isaac Grimball, And further my Will and meaning is that such Division shall be made at the same time when my Estate is Divided into three Equal parts, for my Wife to Receive her Third, and these parts and Respective Dividends of Each of my three Younger Sons viz: Thomas, Joshu and Isaac, be Respectively Delivered to each of them as they shall respectively arrive to the Age of Twenty One Years, or at the Day of their Respective Marriages if sooner by my Executors hereafter Named & Appointed, But my Son Paul I Will to Possess his Equall share of the said Dividend Immediately after my Decease, And further my Will and pleasure is that my Estate be not Administered upon after my decease, but that the same remain In Kind as it shall be at the time of my decease, And that no part nor parcels thereof be brought to Appraisment, Except perishable Goods such as may be subject to decay before my Children comes to the Age of Twenty One Years Respectively if any such happen to the Respective Dividends of any of my aforesaid three Younger Sons My Will and meaning is that the same be Appraised, and the Money thence Arising to be

Item I will that my three Younger Sons be brought up and maintained to each of them Respective Ages out of the Labour of their Respective Slaves and Increase of their Respective Stocks of Horses, Cattle, Sheep and Hogs, and that the principal be kept coming to each of them when they shall Respectively arrive to the Age aforesaid, and further my Will is that all possible Endeavours be used to give each of my Children a competent Measure of Learning and Education, & that they may be taught to read perfect English, to write a legible hand fit for publick business, or Office, and of Mathematics through the Route of Flemish.

Item I will and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Paul Grimball and his heirs forever after death or Marriage of my Loving Wife Sarah my plantation whereon I now live Containing One Thousand Acres of Land with all and Singular the Appurtenances therunto belonging or In any way appertaining.

Item I Will and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Thomas Grimball and his heirs forever five hundred Acres of Land lying and being Situate on Port Royal Island with all and Singular the Appurtenances therunto belonging or In any way appertaining.

Item I Will and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Joshu Grimball the Remaining part or Residue of the Tract of Land whereon I now live, being Situate on Burnt house Creek Containing Two hundred and Ninety Acres with all and Singular the Appurtenances therunto belonging or In any way appertaining, unto him and his forever.

Item I Will and Bequeath unto my Loving Son Isaac Grimball and his heirs forever a Tract of Land on Trist Island Containing two hundred and Ninety Acres adjoining to the Lands of Larrene, Dennis, and the Lands of Thomas Pamphlet as in and by the Grant from under the hand of Governor Moore Reference being thereunto had will largely appear.
