I will that all my just debts and funeral Expences be first paid. Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Sarah Collins, the sum of One Hundred Pounds and many of the Province, to be paid her in one Year after my decease, Provided, and upon this Condition only, that neither she my said Wife Sarah, nor any other person or persons whatsoever for or in right of her, shall at any time or times hereafter, directly or indirectly have or lay any manner of Claim or demand to the third or any other part of my Estate either Real or Personal, or any part thereof, but that upon payment made of the said Legacy of One hundred Pounds as aforesaid, she shall be for ever barred, and moreover give or cause to be given a full and sufficient discharge and Release according to the true intent and meaning of this my Will, and to prevent any Claim, Challenge, or demand of Debt, Interest or other allowance, out of my said Estate for ever, from her. Item I give, devise and bequeath unto my loving Brother Thomas Collins all that my Island or Tract of Land in this Province, commonly called Bulls Island, containing fifteen hundred and eighty Acres, or thereabouts, formerly belonging to my Father John Collins deceased; Together with all and singular the houses, buildings, woods, Stock of Cattle, Horses, and appurtenances whatsoever thereon being, or thereunto in any wise being used. To have and to hold the said Land and premises to the said Sarah Collins, his heirs and Assigns for ever.
 Upon Condition nevertheless that he do well and truly pay unto John Alexander White, the Son of John White, of this Province, the sum of One hundred Pounds, current money of this Province, within one Year after my decease; in case the said John Alexander White be then living, and not otherwise.
