To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting,

Whereas Anne Gough, a Minor, now of this Province, of the
age of Fourteen Years and upwards, hath this present twenty third day of
October, Anno Domini One Thousand, Seven hundred and twenty four, and
Eleventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King George appeared before
me the said Governour, &c. and His Majesty's honorable Council of the Province
aforesaid, and by Petition humbly prayed, that (for divers reasons in the said Petition
set forth) her honoured Father John Gough, Gen. man may be admitted and
appointed her Guardian, to demand, receive, receive and take into his care and ma-
nagement, the said Minor's Interest and Estate, of nature or kind never. And
Whereas the said John Gough hath likewise appeared as aforesaid, and accepted
the charge of the said Guardianship: Know ye therefore that for the better
securing and procuring of the interest, rights and Estate whatsoever, and for the
more careful maintaining and educating, of the said Anne Gough, Infant, Orphan,
and Child of Rebecca Gough (as is said) late Wife of the aforesaid John Gough,
of this Province, out of the confidence (I have) of the integrity, care and upright-
ness of him the said John Gough (and for which good security is given in His Majesty's
Secretary's Office of this Province) the tuition, Guardianship and Education of the said
Anne Gough, the Minor, to him the said John Gough is committed; and he the said
John Gough Tutor and Guardian of the said Anne Gough is hereby made and ordained,
Whereby he is empowered and hereby charged to inquire into, demand, sue for, levy,
request, recover, receive, and take into his care, charge and management, all the goods,
rights, interest and duty of the said Minor whatsoever, and wheresoever the same is or
may be, and to cause the said Anne Gough to be maintained and educated in all
things as becometh her degree and quality during her minority or the time, he shall
be under the tuition and Guardianship of him the said John Gough; and to do all
other things as a Guardian by Law can, may or ought to do; he being also obliged to
render a true and faithful account of all the money and goods whatsoever
belonging to the said Minor, which shall come to his hands and possession, or
into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him, when he
shall be thereunto required by such Guardian or Guardians as shall hereafter be
chosen by the said Anne Gough, and duly authorized, or to the said Anne Gough
when she shall come of age to demand and receive the same by Law.
