I give and bequeath unto my best beloved friends Doct^r John Gibson, John Jones and John Carver all my fire Arms and all my Weapons, my gold ring and all my home furniture to be equally divided betwixt the above three friends. I give and bequeath unto my beloved friend Abaandon Brown all my Tobacco to all my linen. I give and bequeath unto William Valentine the sum of Twenty and five pounds, and it is my last Will and desire that all the above be paid and all my just debts shall be paid, and all the rest of my Estate I give and bequeath unto my best beloved friends Captain John Gibson, M^{cc} Roger Moor & Captⁿ John Harleton, my true and lawful Executors. I declare this to be my last Will and Testament, in Witness whereof I have signed this day of March One Thousand seven hundred twenty and four. Ar. M^{cc}hibben

Governor and Ordinary of this His Majesty's Province of South Carolina, to admit this our Letter of Renunciation to be Recorded, and that we and each of us may be excused from acting as Executors to the said Will; and Do by these presents make, constitute, appoint one or more Executor or Executors to accept and administer this our Act of Renunciation (if the same shall be desired or required). The Deposition of John Skinner late master and Commander of the Ship Defiance, who being duly sworn saith
 That on or about the 4th of April last in the Latitude of 21 and 32 he was taken by a Pirate Ship called the Scarnimph commanded by one whose the Pirates called their Quarter master, his name not known; That the said Pirates forced two of this Deponents men, one called James Wright; another called James Bennett; James Wright is a middle sized man with Broom lank hair if not cut off his face & hands much freckled aged about forty four years; James Bennett a little man with Black curly hair of a Brown complexion and smooth face aged about twenty seven years; This Depo. saith that these two persons were much against their Inclinations forced aboard the said Pirate and threatened with Death if they would not go with them and further saith not
