Wisdom & Integrity of him the sd. John Grange & for the better
Tuition & Guardianship; & the Education of him the said Hugh, to the
John Grange his Brother according to his desire, Hereby charging him
that he do maintain him in meate Drink washing Lodging Schooling

cloathing & such good Education as may be fitting according to the Circumstances &
Interest of the said Infant & seeing his minority and that the said John Grange
personally do all other things as a Guardian by Law may or can doe & a true &
faithfull Acct thereof & what Estate of the said Hugh Grange shall come to his hands
he is to receive & he shall be thereunto required by such Guardian or Guardians as
shall be chosen by the said Hugh Grange or which he shall obtain the Age of One
twelve years.

moving hath and by these presents doth assent and agree to take upon
him the burden of the Execution of the said last Will and Testament of the
said George Flood or the Administration of the Goods and Chattels of the said
Deed to the intent and purpose that the Administration of all and Singular
the goods - Chattels of the said Deed & the Will Annexed may be granted and
committed unto Mary Flood Widow and Relict & Executrix of the said George
Flood Deed & said Mary Flood is the other Executor of the said Deed

pleas'd God to bless me in this life I give Devise & Dispose of the same in the
following Manner and form.

First My Will is that all my Debts be paid and satisfied
from my Estate and bequeath all my Estate both real and personal to be Equally divided
between my Dear and well beloved Wife Mary Flood and my three Children
Thomas Flood William Flood and George Flood what I here give and bequeath
to my three Children Thomas Flood William Flood and George Flood if any of them
shall lack respectively in any the same when they come legally to the age of
Eighteen years and not before, and what is in grace I give to them and their heirs
for ever.

Second I nominate constitute ordain and appoint my Dear and well beloved wife
Mary Flood Executrix of this my last Will & Testament, together with my two
well beloved friends John Lupton and Tho^s Baken Esq^r George and Jonathan
all and every of them and other bills and legacies bequeath and given to me
before this time written and bequeath, Relieving and Confirming this and
the other to be my last will and Testament to be true and valid in all
Let my hand and feet my seal the day and year first above written
