The Last Will and Testament of Charles Machlanc Esq^r Decd: 11. 12. 29:

In the name of God Amen, The third day of December, Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and twenty five, I Charles Machlanc of Charles Town in the Prov^{ince} of South Carolina, being sick in body, but of good & Perfect Memory, and calling to Remembrance the uncertain Estate of this transitory life Do make and Declare this my last Will, and Testament, in manner and form following, First, I Commend my Soul to Almighty God, my Saviour & Redeemer, and my body I commit to Earth, to be decently Buried, at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and for settling of my Temporal Estate and such Goods and Chattels, and I will hath pleased God to bestow on me, I do Order, Give, and Dispose the same in manner and form as following (that is to say)

I Give and bequeath unto my loving Friend, Sonot Crining and Elizabeth M all my ready Money, Goods, Chattels, & Debts whatsoever, as is hereafter mentioned, to be equally Divided between the said Sonot Crining & Elizabeth M. The Monies, Goods, and Debts, are in the Hands and in the Possession of the Persons as followeth (First) In the Hands of Alexander Dennis of Charles Town Eighty three Pounds of eight shillings half Pounds of eight shillings double do and one hundred and twenty four Gallons of Rum, In the hands of Joseph Doff of Charles Town aforesaid Thirty seven Pounds, twelve shillings and six pence Carolina Money, and forty eight Gallons of Fine Juice, In the hands of John Conick at St. Charles in Jamaica Twenty two Pounds, eight shillings five pence, half penny Jamaica Money, And thereby make and appoint my

loving Friends William Machinrey and Alexander Dennis, full and sole Executors of this my last Will, and Testament hereby appointing, Disanuling and making Void, all former Wills, and Bequests by me made, and Declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my Hand & Seal, the Day & Year above mentioned.
