The Last Will and Testament of Charles MacLaine, Esq^r P^r 1^o. M^o 29:

In the name of God Amen, The third Day of December, anno Domini One
Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty five, I Charles MacLaine of Charles Town in the Province
of South Carolina, being Sick in Body, but of good & Perfect Memory, and calling to
Remembrance the uncertain Estate of this transitory life, Do make and Declare
this my last Will and Testament, in manner and Form following, First, I Commit
my Soul to Almighty God, my Actions to my Deemer, and my Body I commit to
Earth, to be decently Buried, at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named
and for settling of my Temporal Estate and such Goods and Chattels, and I
do make and give to be done in me, the Order, Que^r, and Disposse the same
manner and form as following (that is to say)

I give and bequeath unto my loving Friends, Joseph Dennis and Elizabeth M^r
all my ready Money, Goods, Chattels, & Debts whatsoever, as is hereafter
mention'd, to be equally Divided Between the said Joseph Dennis & C^r M^r
The Money, Goods, and Debts, are in the Hands and in the Possession of two
Persons, as followeth. (viz) In the Hands of Alexander Dennis of Charles Town
Eighty three Piess of eight Linen in half Piess of eight, Linen double, &
and one hundred and thirteen gallons of Rum, In the hands of Joseph Dennis
of Charles Town aforesaid Thirty seven Pounds, twelve Shillings and six pence
Carolina Money, and forty eight Gallons of Wine, in the hands of Dr^r
John French at 1^o P^r in Summe Twenty two Pounds, eight Shillings six
pence half penny Jamaica Money, And thereby make and appoint my

loving Friends William Machinney and Alexander Dennis, full and sole Executors
of this my last Will and Testament, timely Executing, Disannulling and making Void, all
former Wills, and Testaments by me made, and Declaring this only to be my last Will
and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my Hand & Seal, the Day &
Year above mentioned.
