The Last Will & Testament of George Brandon

In the name of God amen I George Brandon of Charles Town in
Berkley County in the province of Carolina the late Cooper being of
sound mind and memory thanks be to god for it do make and Ordain this
my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say—
First I give and bequeath to my son George forty pounds, Henry I give
to my sons Richard and Thomas to each of them twenty pounds, Item
I Give to my son Stephen ten pounds and to my son Henry five pounds all
current money of this province to be paid out of the monies that shall be
raised by the sale of my plantation or tract of Land fronting on Ashley
River on the South and the broad path and lying between a tract of
Land of Patrick Scott on the South East and of Richard Cartwright on
the North East: as soon as the said Lands can be sold and I do hereby give
and grant unto my Executors and Executors my full power and authority
to grant bargain sell and Convey the said Tract of Land with all its
rights members and appurtenances in fee simple or any other Estate
whatsoever for raising money to pay the Legacies above given Item I give
unto my said son Stephen my Tenements and Lands now in my possession
in Charles Town aforesaid with their appurtenances after the decease
my wife to hold to him and his heirs of his body lawfully begotten or to be
begotten the remainder to my son Thomas and his heirs of his body
lawfully to be begotten the remainder to my son Henry and his heirs for

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them I give to my loving wife Elizabeth four Acres of Land fronting on Cooper
River to hold to her and her heirs for ever. Item all the rest of my Lands slaves
goods and Chattels what soever moveable and immovable I give to my said wife
whom I make full and whole Executrix of this my Will for her maintenance &
the maintenance and Education of my younger Children that is to say my Son
Henry and my Daughters Sarah and Elizabeth and my Will is that what shall remain
after the Decease of my said Wife shall be equally divided between my said Son
Henry and my Daughters Sarah and Elizabeth, and the Survivors of them and be paid &
delivered to them at their respective ages of one and twenty years and in case my said
Wife shall happen to die before my said Children shall have attained their said ages
of one and twenty then I do further constitute and appoint my loving friends Mr.
Benjamin Lambolt and Mr. James Lawrence both of Charles Town aforesaid my
further Executors in Trust; and do desire them to take care of the maintenance and
Education of my said three younger Children out of and with what Goods & Chattels
shall be left at the time of my wifes Decease and to distribute the remainder thereof
amongst my said three younger Children at their attaining the age of one and
twenty years respectively or to the Survivors or Survivor of them In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal and here published and declared
this to be my last Will and Testament the one and twentieth day of December in the
Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and five

To all persons to whom these Presents shall come I, Jane Gile do send greeting. Know ye that I, Jane Gile, of Sashly County in the Province of South Carolina, Gentle Woman, for and in consideration of Love, good Will and Affection which I have & do bear towards my beloved Son Henry Gile of the same County & Province aforesaid, have given granted & by these Presents do fully, clearly & absolutely give, grant, Confirm & make over unto the said Henry Gile, when arrived to the age of one & Twenty years his Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, two Negro Children named David, & Hannah being now in my Affection. One Gold ring one small Bible one Heifer & one Increase, To have and to hold the said two Negroes, The gold ring Bible Heifer & Increase, to him the said Henry Gile his Heirs and Assigns from hence forth as his proper slaves, provided nevertheless the aforesaid Henry Gile when arrived to the age of one and Twenty years do pay or Cause to be paid unto my beloved friend Henry Cornish his Heirs Executors Admrs and Assigns, The sum or sums of Money, which shall be laid out by the said Henry Cornish his Heirs Executors Admrs or Assigns in discharging what Debts were Contracted by Henry Gile Sent Father, to the aforesaid Henry Gile and only the first Child that lives to the age one year that shall be born of the aforesaid Negroes Hannah I freely give to my beloved friend Henry Cornish, without any manner of Condition whatsoever, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty Second Day of June in the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George, by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France & Ireland, and in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Twenty four.
