this transitory life, do make and declare this my last will & testament, that it is to say, I do give & bequeath to my
well beloved Cousin Alice Thomas Simon, late of the parish of
Morgam in great Britain, but now of Philadelphia in America,
some of this present current money of Pennsylvania above said,
and all the rest of my estate real & personal, I do give, devise &
bequeath unto my well beloved Brother Edward Bullard, And I do
hereby nominate & appoint him to be sole executor of this my
last will & testament, And I do hereby revoke & make void all
former Wills & testaments by me heretofore made, In Testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this sixth day
of November being of ninth year of his Majesty's reign
Anno Domini 1724. In the presence of Hopkin Bullard
Isabel delivered in the presence of Charles Moore, Richard
Holly, Wm Daviss, Philadelphia 17. January 1725, Who
personally appeared Charles Moore & Richard Holly two of
us, witnesses to the foregoing will, & on their Oaths did declare
they saw & heard the Testator sign, seal, publish & declare
