I Charles Town, in the Province aforesaid, being this Twenty-fifth Day of April in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and thirty one, and calling to Remembrance the Uncertainty of Human Life and being willing to set my House in Order, Do constitute Ordain and declare this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that Will and Testament and Testamentary bequest, to me made, and declared either by word or writing, and this will to be taken for my last Will and Testament and none other, and not being Sane and of sound Mind, and being forworn of Almighty God for my Name, I do hereby commit my Soul into the hands of my Lord and Redeemer, Jesus Christ, in whose hands alone I hope for Salvation, and my Body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors, hereafter named, and for the settling of my Temporal Estate whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me, I give and bequeath the same in manner following, that is to say, In the first place, I will that all my just Debts and Funeral Expenses be paid out of all my Estate Real or personal or mixed whatsoever, and then afterwards I give and bequeath to Capt. Thomas Herbert the sum of ten pounds to buy mourning, then I give and bequeath to my dear Son William Parish and his Child their Freedom, within one Year after my Decease provided he continue to stay with and serve my loving wife until that time, and do hereby declare them free accordingly, Lastly all the Residue and Remainder of my Estate whatsoever and of what whatsoever and wheresoever Debts, Rights and Credits I give and bequeath unto my dear and loving wife Anne Parish, her Heirs and Assigns for ever, whom I also make sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, My Witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal the Day and Year above.
