I James Ellis of South Carolina, Carpenter, in Charles Town being sick and weak in Body but sound in mind and Memory, being desir'd by God for the same, do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following and first I give and bequeath my body to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in decency, as my Executors hereafter mentioned shall think fitt, and my soul to God that gave it in hope to be rais'd at the last day according to their scriptures, and as for what worldly goods the Lord has been pleas'd to bestow on me I give in manner and form following, Viz.

Imp: I give and bequeath to my son John Ellis twenty three foot Measure of land (of the land I now enjoy) and so downwards in proportionable therunto, at the choice of my said son, to him and his heirs for ever.

Imp: I give and bequeath To my aforesaid son John Ellis my Negro Boy named Peter, to him and his heirs for ever.

Imp: I give and bequeath to my son James Ellis my House with a fifty foot in length and half proportionable all the way downwards as aforesaid, and I give and bequeath to my son James Ellis my Negro boy named Isaac, to him and his heirs for ever, and also give to my son John Ellis my Gun &c.

Imp: I will and bequeath unto my Daughters Elizabeth my eldest my best Paid and Cloathing upwards, also one Gold Ring, one Girdle, one Buckled Silver and one Beave of Eight and all the stock that is found at my Decease to my Daughter Elizabeth Ellis, to her and her heirs for ever.

Imp: I give and bequeath unto my son William Thomas and my Daughter Elizabeth all and singular my Lands and Premises besides what was mentioned before to be Equally Divided amongst them.

Imp: I give and bequeath all unto all my aforesaid Children all my moveables besides what was mentioned as aforesaid to be Equally Divided amongst all my aforesaid Children and (also) that my Negro Woman named Hanny with her issue to be Equally Divided between my Youngest Children Elizabeth Ellis, William Ellis and Thomas Ellis to them and their heirs for ever &c.

Imp: I give and bequeath all my Wife's wearing Cloaths to be given unto my Daughter Elizabeth Ellis, to her and her heirs for ever.

Imp: Lastly I will and desire that my trusty Friends Mr. William Elliot and John Brown and my aforesaid son John Ellis To be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament, as Witness my hand, this tenth Day of August Anno Domini seventeen hundred Twenty and four
