 to him his Heirs and Assigns after he is attained to the age of
 Twenty one Years as aforesaid.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary
 Blumire one Negro Girl named Phillis and one Indian Woman
 named Lucinda as also the sum of One hundred pounds Current
 money of this Province to be paid to my said Daughter Mary
 Blumire when she my said Daughter Mary Blumire shall

Attain to the age of one and twenty Year or day of Marriage
 which shall first happen which said sum of One hundred pounds and
 two Indian Boys and Indian Woman named Lucinda I give and bequeath
 unto my said Daughter her Heirs and Assigns at the time before ex-
 pressed Item I give Devise and bequeath unto my loving
 Wife Mary Blumire all and every parcel of the remaining part of
 my Real and personal Estate of what kind soever and where soever
 lying and being which I give to her her Heirs and Assigns in and to
 whom I recommend the care and Education of my aforesaid Son and
 daughter And lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and en-
 appoint my loving Wife Mary aforesaid John Croft of Charles Town to
