County in the Province of South Carolina, Planter, being very rich and
wealthy in body, but in perfect mind and memory, thank be given unto
God therefore, calling unto mind the mortality of my body, & knowing
that it is appointed for all Men once to die, do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament, that is to say, personally and first of all, give
and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it, and for my body
I commend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner, at the
discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection, I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly
Estate wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, bequeath and

Dispose of the same in the following manner and form. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Jane Jackson the use of my whole Estate for three Year and four Months from the date hereof for to pay all my debts which is due or shall become due. Item I do give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife her share here, for her and Offspring; and in use of one negro girl named Miles during her life, and after her decease the said negro Girl Miles shall be for my Daughter Mrs Jackson her heirs and Offspring for ever. Item I do give and bequeath unto my son John Jackson my house and land where I now dwell, for him his heirs and Offspring for ever at the expiration of three year and four months from the date hereof. Item I do give and bequeath unto my son John Jackson two hundred acres of land, to him, his heirs and Offspring for ever which said two hundred acres of land is joining to Benjamin Reynolds land, and is part of a tract of four hundred acres, and the remaining two hundred acres of land which is joining to Mr Johnston and his heirs and bequeath unto my sons Philemon and George Jackson, to them their heirs and Offspring for ever. Item I do give and bequeath unto my Brother Henry Jackson my best Gun. Item I do give and bequeath unto my Children Mary Glaze John Jackson Thomas Jackson Philemon Jackson and George Jackson all my personalty Goods, including my household goods, and one negro Girl named Annah, to be equally divided among my Offspring Children, at the expiration of three year and four Months from the date hereof. Item I do give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Glaze the aforementioned negro Girl named Annah, for her and Offspring for ever, and for my household goods I leave to be divided among my Children, at the expiration of my life and Jackson whom do constitute, make and Ordain Executors, and my Brother Henry Jackson Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, and for Henry utterly disallow, revoke and disannul and every other former Testaments, wills and Legacies, Requests and bequests, by me in any ways before this time made, made and bequeathed, Ratified and confirmed. This and no other to be my Last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
