Whereas John Mangum of this Province Planter hath this Day
made humble suit to me in Council by Petition setting forth that he
lately intermarried with Ann Steady who at the time of such intermarriage
had a considerable Real and personal Estate in the hands of three
several Trustees therein named

That the Petitioner could not enjoy the share or part of the
said Wife without the appointment of some proper persons to share the
said Estate between the Petitioner (in right of his Wife) and others
who are to share and partake of the same. It was therefore
ordered that such persons or persons might be accordingly appointed
for that purpose as to me should seem meet.

These are therefore to authorize and empower you the said
persons above mentioned to view Appraise and Value (or if the same
shall be already made) Equally to share Divide and allot the
Estate and Effects in the hands of the said Trustees above mentioned
for the use of the several parties who are to share and partake
of the same according to their several and respective interests
therein and to cause the same to be returned ~~as~~ into
the Secretary's Office of this Province under your hands or of
any three or more of you in Order to be recorded on or before the
first Day of October next ensuing.
