And I desire my Executors that the my daughter Mary, and my son John be put to school and given such Education as is suitable to my Circumstance & fortune, and I do constitute, Ordains and appoint My well loved and trusty friend Brother in Law Samuell West, and my well loved Brother in Law Richard Butler to be Executors in Trust of this my last will and Testament, and desiring and hoping that they will see this my will performed, and what plainer and trouble they be at, to be paid out of the profits arising out of my estate And as a Testimony of my Acknowledgment I give to each of them the sum of five pounds, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the fifteenth day of September one thousand seven hundred & Ninety nine, in the presence of us.
