Memorandum, That on this present day of Feb^{ry} 18th 1784 Mrs. personally came and appeared before me J^{es} & Waring Esq^s one of His Maj^{ty} Justices of the Peace for the County of Berkleigh, Cap^t & Thos. Rich^d. Esq^s Oldfield Esq^r, M^r Nath^l Green, being three of the Apprais^{rs} appointed and by the within Warrant of Appraisment, and were sworn to make a full and perfect Inventory and appraisment of all such goods of Philip Lygon late dec^d. as should be shewn to them by M^r Mathew Beard sole Executor of the last Will and Testament of the said dec^d, and to cause due return to be made of the same.  In the name of God, Amen, Sept^r 2th 1718. I, John Sanders of the Parish of St. James, free-freeh, in the Province of South Carolina, Planter, being sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God therefore, calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all Mankind Once to die, Do make an Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, That is to say, Principally and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it, and fit my Body to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner, not doubting but all the General Resurrection I shall receive the same. And as touching such worldly Estates wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me, with in this Life I give, devise and dispose of the same, in the following manner and form

I give and bequeath unto my Loving Mother, One Horse and
as the said Horse best to be taken out of my Stock, as also the sum of ^{Twenty} ~~Twenty~~
pounds, to be paid out in a Mourning Ring. Item I give and bequeath
unto my Loving Brother Joshua Sanders, One Negro Man, by Name Sam-
uel and One Negro Woman by name Judy and Mill, And in case of his death
without Years Begot of this Body, then the said Slaves to be Equally
between the Brothers then Living. Item I give and bequeath unto my
Loving Brother William Sanders (Three Negro women by name Hannah
Nanah and Mariah and in case of his death without Years Begot of this
then the said Slaves to be Equally divided and between the Brothers then
Living. I Give and bequeath unto my Loving Cousin Catherine I
One Negro Man by Name Francis and till my Brother Wilson S.
shall build her a Dwelling House upon some part of the Tract of Land
now live on. As the said House Government, as also to have six Good Mills
Come out of my stock, all which shall be returned to my Brother Wilson
Sanders all the day of her death or Marriage, which shall first happen
Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Loving Brother William Sanders and
his My Last Will and Testament One Negro Boy, by Name Job As
Also all my Lows, Cattle, Horses, Sheep or other Stock, Or Plantation -
that all my debts that I owe in Justice or Equity be fully satisfied, and
that if either of my Brothers Joshua or William Sanders should have a mind
to settle for themselves in two years after the first of January next ensuing
all the Cattle, Horses, Sheep and other Stock, as also of all the Plantation
Tools whatsoever.

At a Council held at the Council Chamber July the 24th 1734.

The Will Verdict Annied was then proved by the Oaths of Nathl. Snow and John Herbert, Two of the witnesses thereto, who also on their Oaths declared that they saw Sarah Herbert, the Other Witness thereto, subscribe her name as a witness thereto at the request of the Testator, and that the Testator was then present, and that the said Sarah Herbert, was named in the said Will as the sole and lawful Executor thereof, and the Executors Oath to him Administered.
