Item I give to my son John one Negro man Caffe and Indian woman named Mabe one Negro boy named Jack and an equal of every stock of cattle & household goods to him his heirs & assigns for ever.

Sim I give to my Son Benjamin one Negro Woman named Bethena one Negro boy named Gram one Negro boy named July and an Equal Share of all my Stock of Cattle & household goods to him his heirs & assigns forever.

him. I give to my Daughter, but two shillings, and one penny.

I am I give unto my three sons William, John, & Benning, all my Land contain-
ing Hundred and Eighty Acres to be Equally Divided as they come of age &
in case any one of them should dye before they come of age or what
Remain then in my will is that what ever I have left them to be Equally
Divided amongst the living.
