The Last Will & Testament of Chas Simeon B. 1725

In the Name of God Amen I John Symrell of Charles Town in the Province
of South Carolina Barber being of good perfect & sound memory made this
Almighty God doe make and Ordaine my last Will and Testament in manner and
form following that is to say

I command my Soul to the Mercy and protection of Almighty God being
fully possessed by his Holy Spirit through the death and passion of Christ
to obtain full pardon and remission of all my sins and to inherit everlasting
Life and my Body I commit to the earth to be decently buried

I am my Will & Testament forsooth that you shall be first made
unburdened

I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Symrell all my Estate both
real and personal (that is to say) One house being named George and one Negro woman
named Simeon & her and all other Goods of what nature so ever I am
now possessed of so shall for her use so long as it shall please God the same to live
I am also give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Symrell all that
part and remaining time yet to come unburdened of the care of the house and
land w^t I hold of Richard Collier and now likewise to her for her use if please
God the same so long as she I am further Will is that you shall please God
to visit my loving wife Mary Symrell with a long and tedious sickness &
of limb accident by sea or any other unexcepted misfortune that to the lives
above mentioned are not sufficient to support her Wives and necessities that
then and in such case by & the advice and consent of my heirs herein after
named that any part of the above mentioned Estate shall and may be sold and
disposed off and towards the support here to have and to use the uses of the
abovementioned and nothing more And I do by these presents make Ordain
Nominate & appoint my loving friend Thomas Fairchild and Richard Fairchild
to be my Heirs to take my last Will and Testament And so far my will is that
after the decease of my loving wife Mary Symrell that all and every part and
and piece of the remaining and residue of the above mentioned Estate all such
Debts and funerall Expenses first being paid and discharged shall be disposed of
by my above named Heirs to such Creditable uses as they shall think fit and
Approve of and do as by these presents aforesaid friends to make & furnish
all former Debts & Defects by me heretofore made In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal the twenty fifth day of September anno

one thousand One hundred and seven hundred and Sixty five of Charles Town
in the Province aforesaid before the Hon^rble Thomas Moore Esq^r then Governor
in Council the last Will & Testament of John Simcock late of Charles Town in
Charleston County in the said Province deceased the day whereof is to be present
annexed was proved approved & allowed of the said Deceased having whilst he
lived at the time of his decease diverse goods Right & Credits within the province
of South Carolina by means whereof no approbation & allowance of his Settlement to the power
of granting the Administration of all & singular the goods Right & Credits of the
said Deceased and also the rendering the said Calculations & Exhortations of the
said Administration of same Summation & Discharge from the same is manifestly
known to belong and that the summae value of the said singular the goods Right &
Credits of the said Deceased to take notice hereinafter at the time of his Decease

William Sherriff of Colleton County Planter knowing that Death is certain
But the time when uncertain to mankind & that it is a Christian Duty to
Disentangle himself of worldly concerns as much as possible that he may the
better attend his Lord's call. Being at this time in perfect health & sound in judgment
and reason blessed be God do make this my last will & Testament revoking all others
by me formerly made & commanding my former trust to be given to God in Christ Jesus
my only Lord & Redeemer for Decant of my body to be decently buried
by my Executors the Ministers of the Assembly Church at Wilson in Colleton
County whom I Constitute & appoint to execute my last will & Testament
fulfilled according to the tenor & true intent of the same

My Will is that all my just & due full Debt be honestly paid
I give & Bequeath one hundred pounds Current money of this Province for
the perpetual use of the Church belonging to the aforesaid Brethren always
preferring the principle intent

I Give & Bequeath one hundred pounds Current money of this Province to
any one or more of my Sisters Elizabeth & Children coming unto this Province
Within two years after my Decease but if none come within 6 years and time
then the 50 hundred pounds shall be for & aforesaid use at the discretion of me
