of this my last Will & Testament Hereby Revoking disannulling and repealing

In Pursuance of an Act made Anno Septimo et Octavo Willielmi III: Regis Entituled an act for Preventing Frauds & Regulating abuses in the Plantation trade

I Will at Newbern Simmons of Charles Town Mariner that the Schooner Swallow of South Carolina whereof he is the said Newbern Simmons is at Present Master being a Square Stern Vessel of the burden of Sixty five tons or thereabouts was built at Stratford in the Colony of Connecticut in the year one thousand Seven hundred & Sixteen (as appears by the former Register Delivered up & cancelled) and that he this Respondent together w Francis Holms Junr and Henry Penneau Junr both of this Province are sole Owners thereof and that no Foreigner Directly or indirectly hath any Share or Part or Interest therein

Which Oath above said was taken this Sixteenth Day of December before the hon: Arthur Middleton Esq: Presidt & Commander in Chief & Thomas Godden Esq: Collector of his Maj: Customs in the province aforesaid in the Sixteenth Year of his Maj: Reign anno Domini 1723

Last Will and Testament of John Caswell Esq^rDated 11 Nov^r

In the name of God Amen, I John Caswell of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina late & lady such a widow in my last will & Testament disposing of my Estate & Shanks be to God Do make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament in manner & following (to wit) First I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping for acceptance of my soul through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ and my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the expense of my executors hereafter named under the control of God who has bestowed on me the sume of the value as follow

Item I will that all my just debts be duly paid & satisfied with all convenient speed after my death I give and bequeath unto Charles Hill and Andrew Allen Esq^r and to the survivor of them & to the executors & trustees of such Survivor the sume of three Thousand pounds Sterling Money of the Province of South Carolina upon this special trust and condition nevertheless that they shall Charles Hill & Andrew Allen or the survivor of them & the trustee & adm^r of such Survivor Do within two years next after my decease apply the said sume of three thousand pounds towards the repairing and Dowering of new Parish church in Charles Town in such manner as they shall think fit in no other use or purpose what so ever and my Will is that the said sume of three thousand pounds shall be laid out and applied as aforesaid

Item I give and bequeath unto Mary Lawood Anne Caswell & Jane Caswell Daughters of my deceased brother Edward Caswell the sume of one hundred pounds Sterling Money of great Britain each to be remitted to them by my executors within one year of my decease

Item I give and bequeath unto Anne Graves the Daughter of John Graves of Kingstⁿ upon the sume of one hundred pounds Sterling to be remitted to her in one year of my decease

Item I give unto the Master and Wardens of Tunbridge house in Hills the sume of ten pounds Sterling to be laid out in a piece of plate for the use of the said Master

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Caswell One third part of all my estate personal to hold to my said wife her & to her Nomins and Assigns for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Gibbon Caswell all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to hold to my said Daughter Gibbon Caswell her heirs Nomins and Assigns for ever But in Case it should happen that my said Daughter shall depart this life before she attains her age of two one years or shall be married then I do hereby give and bequeath all the said rest and residue of my estate both real and personal unto the said Mary Caswell Anne Caswell and Jane Caswell Daughters of my said Brother Edward Caswell their heirs Nomins & Assigns for ever

Item My Will is that all my Stock and Fittments employed in trade and Shipping collected and gathered in as soon as possible after my decease and that the same may thereby be put out to Interest on good Security provided the said Stock be not called in in less than one year

Item I do nominate constitute and appoint Charles Hill & Andrew Allen Esq^r executors of my last will & Testament and Guardians of my Daughter Gibbon Caswell until she shall attain unto her age of twenty one years shall be married In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal to the my last will & Testament contained in two Sheets the seventh day of

of October in the fiftieth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King George the second in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & twenty five
