In the name of God Amen this Twenty ninth day of Nov: in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty four. I Joseph Monk of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina. Winner, being rich and weak in Body, but of perfect mind, memory and understanding, thank to Almighty God for the same, and considering the uncertainty of this transitory life, do make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following: That is to say: I give my Soul to God and my Body to the Earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named. Item all and every my goods, chattels, debts and effects whatsoever or wheresoever that now hath or shall at the time of my death belong and appertain to me (my debts and funeral expences being first paid and discharged) I give and bequeath the same to my Daughter Sarah Monk, at her arrival to the age of Twenty one Years, or day of Marriage which shall first happen; and in case of her Death, I give the same, and every part thereof to my affectionate Wife Sarah Monk, and to her Execu^r, Adm^r and Appr^r, and do by these presents make and appoint my said Wife to be Guardian to my said Child during his minority. Item I do hereby authorise my Executors hereafter named to sell and dispose of my Effects, and collect in the money, and the surplusage thereof (after my just debts and funeral Expences are paid and discharged) to place out at Interest for the uses and purposes herein before mentioned. Item, I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends John Boyden (to whom I give Ten Pounds) and John Withers (to whom I give the sum of Twenty Pounds and money) to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

In witness whereof revoking and making void all other Wills by me hitherto made, I have to this my last Will and Testament put my hand and seal thereto, and year first written written. Joseph Monk.

Read, Signed, Sealed, Published, and declared by the said Joseph Monk to be his last Will and Testament, in the presence of us, the two interlineations, as to the legacies given to the executors of the said Will, being first made.
