Imprimis I will that all my just debts be satisfied & paid out of the first income of my Estate. From it is my Will that my Executors herein named do sell and dispose of all my lands, goods and chattels, Real and Personal Estate wheresoever the same may be found lying or being in any part of the World and the neat proceeds thereof after my just debts are paid I will and Bequeath to my three Daughters Martha, Susanna and Anne, to be equally shared and divided amongst them and their Heirs for ever. Lastly I do nominate & appoint my loving Friends Col^l. Joseph Blake & Thomas Waring and my loving Daughter Martha to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament, and do hereby revoke and make void & null all other Wills by me made, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Nineteenth day of April, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand, Seven hundred & twenty Four.
