Whereas Nicholas Newlan late of Charles Town in Berkeley County in the Province aforesaid lately dyed Intestate having whilst he lived and at the time of his death diverse goods rights and credits within the Province aforesaid by means whereof the full disposition and power of granting the Administration of all and singular the goods rights and credits of the said Nicholas Newlan and also the due Accounts Calculations and Accounting of the aforesaid Administration and final dismission of the same to me is manifestly known to belong & seeing that the goods rights and credits w^{ch} were of the said dec'd may be well & truly administered executed and disposed of do hereby grant unto you in said Gualth Roberts your fidelity in this behalf I very much confide shall power by the virtue of these to administer the goods rights and credits of the said dec'd w^{ch} to him in his time & at the time of his decease did belong and to ask collect levy recover receive the same and to pay the Debts in which the dec'd was bound so far forth as the said goods rights and credits will extend according

to their Sale and Order of Law being first sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God to make a full and perfect Inventory thereof & to exhibit the same into the Secretary's Office at Charles Town in order to be recorded on or before the first Day of May next ensuing & to render a true & just account & calculation and Accounting of your said Administration when the same shall be required & to obtain depute & constitute you & said Gualth Roberts Administrators of all and singular & goods rights and credits of the said dec'd by these presents In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Fourth Twentieth Day of January Anno Domini 1725 and in the Twelfth year of his Majesty's reign
