A full and perfect Inventory and appraisement of all and singular the goods, rights and credits of Philip Lyon, late dec'd. as they were shewing by Mr. Matthew Beard, sole Executor of the last Will and Testament of the said dec'd. under the Appraisement by and sworn pursuant to a Warrant of Appraisement, bearing date the fifteenth day of December Anno Domini 1724, under the hand of his Excellency the Governor, taken the nineteenth day of February Anno Domini 1724. That on this present day of Feb^{ry} 25th 1724 was personally appeared and appeared before me Benj^y & Waring Esqrs one of His Maj^{ties} Justices of the Peace for the County of Berkeley, Capt. Tobias Pugh, Jnr. Oldfield Esq. Mr. Joshua Green, being three of the Appraisers appointed by the within Warrant of Appraisement, and were sworn to make a full and perfect Inventory and appraisement of all such goods of Philip Lyon late dec'd. as should be shewing to them by Mr. Matthew Beard sole Executor of the last Will and Testament of the said dec'd. and to cause due return to be made of the same. (John Sanders dec'd Will, vid. bond - GG N^o 35.)
In the name of God. Amen, Sept^r 2nd 1728. I John Sanders of the Parish of St James, Grove-Creek in the Province of South Carolina, Planter being sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God therefore, calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all Mankind Once to die, Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, That is to say, Principally and first of all, I Give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it, and for my Body to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner, not doubting but all the General Resurrection I shall receive the same. And as touching such worldly Estates wherewith it please God to bestow me with in this Life, I Give, Devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Mother, One Horse with as the said Horse best to be taken out of my Stock, as also the sum of Three pounds, to be laid out in a Mourning Ring Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Brother Joshua Sanders, One Negro Man by Name Pa and two Negro Women by name Judy and Mill, And in case of the death without Years beget of this Pa, then the said Slaves to be Equally between the Brother then Living. Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Brother William Sanders (Three Negro women by name Phoebe, Nance and Mariah, and in case of his death without Heir beget of any of them the said Slaves to be Equally divided and between the Brothers then living. I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Cousin Catherine I One Negro Man by Name Joseph, and with my Brother Wilson I shall build her a Dwelling House upon some part of the Tract of Land now live on, As the said Land Government, as also to have six Good milch Cows out of my stock, all which shall be returned to my Brother Wilson Sanders at the day of her death or Marriage, which shall first happen. Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Brother Wilson Sanders, and his heirs forever, when I make and appoint what and sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, One Negro Boy by Name Job, As also all my Land, Cattle, Horses, Sheep or other Stock, Or Plantation - that all my debts that I owe in Justice or Equity be fully satisfied, and that if either of my Brothers Joshua or William Sanders should have a mind to settle for themselves in two years after the first of January next ensuing - of all the Cattle, Horses, Sheep and other Stock, as also of all the Plantation Tools whatsoever.

Memorandum before the Signing and ratifying of the above Will in the presence of the above named witnesses.

At a Court held at the General Chamber Feb^{ry} 26th 1728.
The Will last aforesaid was then proved by the oaths of Nath^l Snow and John Herbert, Two of the witnesses thereto, who also on their oaths declared that they saw John Sanders the other Witness thereto subscribe his name as a witness thereto at the request of the Testator, and that the said Sanders was then and there in his full and sound mind, and the Executors with to him appointed.
