Also I give to my loving Daughter Elizabeth Willfale Esq^r to her and her heirs a Negro Man named Pothay and the use of my Chamber during her Widowhood. Also I give to my Grandson W^m Hyde the first Child that shall be born of my negro Woman Moll; But if the said W^m Hyde should die before he comes of Age, then the said negro Child to go to my son Joseph Maybank and his heirs; Also I give to my loving Daughter Swanna Maybank and her heirs for ever in full satisfaction for what was given her by her Father, the house & plantation whereon I now dwell and also a Negro Man named Jerry & a negro Woman named Moll; Also I give to my Daughter Anne Maybank the Bed, Bolster and Pillows in the little Chamber; Also I give to M^{rs} Anne Harton Esq^r Five Pounds. Also I give to my Cousin W^m Mason son of my Uncle William Mason in England a Guinea, with order to be sent him with the first good convenience. Also I give to my

Two Daughters Elizabeth and Susanna, all the Goods left me by my late Wife on my Plantation, and the Cattle on my Plantation to be equally divided between them. And all the rest of my Estate, Goods & Chattels, I give to my Daughter Susanna Maybank and her heirs forever. All of which my Good friends, Eld. George Logan and Mr. Thomas Barton, to be Guardians to my Son Joseph, but their my Daughters Elizabeth & Susanna may have the care of them and Management of his Estate till he shall arrive to the age of Eighteen Years, they rendering an Account yearly to the said Eld. George Logan & Mr. Thomas Barton, but if they shall not approve of their said Accounts, then the said Eld. George Logan & Mr. Thomas Barton, shall take the management into their own hands.
