First I bequeath my soul to Almighty God and my body to the earth. From whence it came and so forth. First I will that all my just debts be paid and I do hereby make void and revoke all other Will or Wills by me made or done. First I give unto my son William Houshupson fifty Acres of Land joining upon John Laroach's Land and my riding Mare and six kids of cattle no more shall be share with the rest of my children I give unto my Daughter Mary Ann Houshupson all the rest of my cattle my young Mare & all my hogs with all the rest of my goods whatsoever and twenty five shillings of Land I give unto my Daughter Sarah Nash twenty five shillings of Land and twenty pounds current money of Carolina or the value thereof to be paid by her sister Mary Ann at the day of her marriage.
