to Ordain deputes and constitute you the said Robert Hilditch Administrator
of all and singular the goods rights and Credits of the said deceased by these

Item I Give unto the Commissioners appointed for building the New Brick Church in Charles Town the Sum of One hundred pounds Curr^t Money to be apply'd by them towards finishing the said Church which said Sum is to be paid out of the Issues & profits of my Real Estate.
