William Holmes dec'd Will. (side bundle) H.H. N. 3.

In the name of God Amen, I William Holmes of Heyne Collings  
County and Province of South Carolina, being weak in body, but of perfect min-  
and memory knowing that I must once die, but in hope of the Resurrection of his  
my body mortal to be changed into an immortal and glorified body, through the  
merits and intercession of my Saviour Jesus Christ, I do make this my last Will and  
Testament, and likewise my Executors hereafter mentioned, I do appoint to act  
up and perform to the best advantage, my said Real and Personal Estate, as  
it hath pleased God to bestow on me, in manner and form following.

Imprimis I will that all my five hundred Acres of Land situate on Cambee  
Island be sold towards payment of my lawful debts contracted, but of the said  
monies fall short of paying the same, that then the remainder so to be raised out  
of my Lands on Heyne, by Crops to be made, from my now hands and aid from  
the said Plantation on said Heyne. Item that my said Lands be kept together  
under and at the command (solely) of my loving Wife Mary Holmes, on my  
foreward Plantation on Heyne, to discharge my said debts, during the term and  
time, and to the full end and term of my son Ralph Holmes his coming to  
age of twenty one years, and the overplus to be equally divided amongst my said  
Wife Mary Holmes, my Sons William, Ralph and George Holmes my lawfull  
begotten Children born of the body of my said lawfull Wife Mary Holmes.  
Item I will that my said loving Wife Mary Holmes live, posses and enjoy and  
plant by my now said Plantation on Heyne, after the separation of my said  
son Ralph Holmes his age of Twenty one years, not exceeding forty Acres, together  
with my now dwelling house &c to live in without trouble or molestation from  
any of my said Children, their or any of their Executors, Administrators and  
Agents during her said natural Life. Item I will bequeath to my Son William  
Holmes after my decease, my Slave called by the name of Manchester, and  
to his heirs and Assigns for ever, he my said son William Holmes allowing at  
division of my said Slaves, or his Executors and Assigns, in proportion for him  
(the said Manchester) hereafter to be made to my other (forementioned) my  
loving Wife Mary Holmes, and my Son Ralph and George Holmes, and to the  
survivors of them. Item I will bequeath to my Sons William and Ralph Holmes  
my said Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land now living on Heyne, equally to be  
divided betwix them the said William and Ralph Holmes shall agree together w<sup>t</sup>  
the advice and consent of my said loving Wife Mary Holmes and Mr. John Bell  
both my hereafter mentioned Executors. But if the said William or Ralph Holmes  
shall die before the age of Twenty one years, that then the said whole Tract of  
Two hundred Acres of Land shall be and fall to the survivor of them. Item  
I will that when my son Ralph Holmes arrives at the age of Twenty one years  
or in case of his death according to that time afore mentioned, that then I will  
that my Slaves now living and their issue then alive shall be equally divided  
between my said loving Wife Mary Holmes, my Sons William and Ralph and  
George Holmes, by Lot, or otherwise, agreeing with my Executors or the survivor  
of them. Item that if my said Five hundred Acres of Land on Cambee Island be  
not disposed of or sold (having no occasion) for the discharge of my said debts, it  
then I will the same to my son George Holmes and his heirs for ever.

Secondly, I do appoint constitute and ordain John Bull of Ford Pond, Gen<sup>m</sup>  
my loving Wife Mary Holmes, and my lawfull begotten Son William Holmes, my  
lawfull Executor to this my last Will and Testament, and that accordingly I do  
hereby revoke, discharge and disannul all former and other Wills, Grants or Deeds  
made or done, by me, heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord god  
One thousand, Seven hundred twenty and four 1724. Wm. Holmes (L)
