whereof I do hereby acknowledge Have granted bargained
and delivered in plain and open Market and by these presents
do grant bargain sell and deliver to the said Thomas Ellery
one Negro Boy named Cogar, To have and to hold the
Negro Boy named Cogar unto the said Thomas Ellery his heirs
assigns for ever To and for the only use benefit & behoof of the
said Thomas Ellery his heirs and assigns forevermore, In
