 Lord 1726 Charles Town in the Province aforesaid before me
 in Council the last will and Testament of Francis Frevier
 late of Berkeley County in the said Province deceased the Copy
 whereof is to these presents annexed was proved approved and
 allowed of the said deceased having whilst he lived and at
 the time of his Death diverse goods rights & Credits within
 the Province aforesaid by means whereof the approbation & allowing
 of his Testament and the power of granting the admecon of all &
 singular the goods rights & Credits of the said deceased & also
 the settling the accounts calculations & reckonings of the said
 admecon and a final Dismission & discharge from the same
 is manifestly known to belong and the admecon of all
 and singular the goods rights & Credits of the said decd

which to him in life time and at the time of his decease did belong
 with the said will and Testament annexed was granted and
 committed unto Ann Meam sole Legatee or more in the said will
 upon the Renunciation of James Carty the Executor in whose
 fidelity in this behalf I very much confide with Power to
 take Collect levy recover and receive the same debts to pay the
 debt in which the said Deceased stood obligated so far forth as
 the said goods rights & Credits will extend according to their

Bill of Sale of six Negro Slaves from William Harrison to John

To all whom these presents shall come I William Harrison of Charles Town
in the Province of South Carolina Gent send Greeting --
Know ye that the said William Harrison for and to consideration of the
sum of one thousand Pounds to me in hand paid or to be paid by
John Borden of Charles Town a foresaid virtual executor before the sealing
and delivery of these presents have bargained and sold and by those
presents do bargain and sell unto the said John Borden all those
six negro slaves viz one negro man named Robin and two negroes
named Angla and Cobana and three negro Women named Indam, Nan
and Sarah to have and to hold the said six negro slaves herein

Before mentioned and intended to be hereby bargained and sold together with
their and every of their Intercourse unto the said John Borden in his last will and
and assigns for ever And I the said William Harrison the said six negro
slaves herein before mentioned and intended to be hereby bargained and sold
and every of them unto the said John Borden in his last will and assigns
against me the said William Harrison my Executors and administrators and
all and every other person and Persons whatsoever shall and will Warrant
and for ever defend by these presents in witness whereof I the said William
Harrison have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Eighth day of month
In the year our Lord one thousand seven hundred twenty five and in the twenty
year of his majestys reign
