South Carolina

To all to Whom these presents shall come greeting

Whereas John Catell of the Age of Nineteen Years (as he said)

by his Petition made humble Suit unto me That his Uncle Mr. John Catell
may be appointed his Guardian for the Reasons in the said Petition
Expressed And the said Peter Catell having accepted the said
Guardianship of the said Infant Sheweth for the better securing
his Estate and for the more careful Maintenance & Education of the said
John Catell, Out of the Trust and Confidence reposed in the Wisdom
Integrity of the said Peter Catell I do hereby Commit the said Infant and
Guardianship of the said John Catell according to his Desire & Trust
Charging him, that he do Maintain him in Manners & Clean Washing
Sodging Schooling Cloathing and such good Education as may be fitting
According to the Circumstances and Interest of the said Infant and do all
Other things as a Guardian by Law may or can do and a true and
Faithfull Account thereof and what Estate of the said Infant shall come
to his hands He is to Render when he shall be thereunto Required

 Hundred Pounds Should it so happen that one of the said Children
 should dye before the payment of the said five hundred pound then
 in that Case my Will is that the Survivor should inherit with her
 own the said five hundred Pounds of the deceased Should they both
 dye I appoint her the said Margaret Clapp to inherit what I have
 to Each of her Children Left

 my Bed Chamber with it Furnitures and my Wearing Apparel &
 the Attendance of a Nurse

I bequeath to a Dissenting Pastor or Preacher and his Successor
 in that Office for Ever on the Week day to be settled on a tract
 of Land lately purchased from Mr^r John Hales & his Wife
 Given to them for Ever for that Use & for himself & his
 of Annun for twenty Years I give to him the said Dissenting
 Pastor or Preacher a hundred shillings per Annum to be paid
