Every the said goods being first sworn on the holy Evangelists  
to make a full & perfect Inventory & appraisment & to  
cause the same to be returned under your hands or of  
any three or four of you into the Secretary's office in  
Charles Town in order to be according on or before the  
twentyeth day of June now next Insuing

In the Name of God Amen I Henry  
Farewell of St Johns Parish in the County of Berkley being  
of sound mind & memory do make and ordain this my last  
Will and Testament in manner and form following: first I  
commend my soul to almighty God and my body to the Earth  
to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors, And as  
touching my temporal Estate I give & Dispose thereof as  
followeth

Impoverished I will that all my debts & funeral Charges shall be paid  
and discharged

And I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Thomas Farewell  
all that Plantation or tract of land lying on Santee River  
& containing by Estimation five Hundred acres of land  
to him and his heirs forever. And I give and bequeath unto  
my son Stevin Farewell the House and Plantation I now live  
in and the one half of the Lands there unto belongin and  
joyning to him and his heirs forever and also I give and  
bequeath unto my son William Farewell all the other half  
of the sd Plantation or parcel of land belongin & joyning to  
the plantation where I now live to him and his heirs forever.  
And a division of the said Plantation & all the lands there unto  
joyning and belongin shall be made by my Executors between  
my sons, Stevin & William as neare as Possibill may be of an  
Equall Quantity and goods & each one of them shall be there  
with contented And give and bequeath unto my eldest son Thomas  
Farewell the one half of all my Personal Estate, Slaves, Stocks  
goods and Chattles Whatsoever: And I give and bequeath unto  
my loving wife Jane Farewell the one fift part of the other  
remaining half of all my Personal Estate of Slaves Stock goods  
& chattles Whatsoever: And all the rest & residue of my Personal

Estate I give and bequeath Equally amongst my fore Children  
 Stevin & William and Cathorn & Martha to be divided equ  
 ly to each one of them an Equall part: And I further Will  
 and require, that my son Thomas Farewell shall pay to his  
 sister Cathorn and to his sister Martha the just  
 sum of one hundred pounds apee to each one of them  
 Lawfull money of Carolina to be paid to either of them  
 wen at y<sup>e</sup> age of twenty years or time of marriage Which  
 shall first be or hapen: And in case either of them should  
 Dy before the time here by Limited for payment then  
 fifty pounds more shall be paid to her that doth survive  
 at such times as is before Exprest out of that which shall  
 have paid to her that is deceas'd and in case of the death  
 of both of them then one hundred pound only shall be paid  
 & equally divided between my sons Stevin & William:  
 I further will that there be a division of the one half <sup>of</sup>  
 my Personal Estate and that y<sup>e</sup> same be delivered to my  
 son Thomas Farewell some time within nine months after  
 my decease he then giving security for payment of  
 the aforesaid money to his two sisters as aforesaid: and  
 further my will is that all the remaining part of my  
 Personal Estate be kept one y<sup>e</sup> Plantation & managed  
 to the best advantage for the maintaining and bring  
 up of my children until my son Stevin attain to the  
 age of twenty years And in case my Wife Jane Farewell  
 shall remain unmarried & single so long and shall be  
 like or be willing to live in the same house wen my  
 son Stevin shall have the possession thereof that then my  
 Executors shall appoint her some other convenient place  
 in the said plantation and my son Stevin shall be at the  
 y<sup>e</sup> charge in building there a convenient house for her

to dwell in During her natural life: And I do here by  
 make and appoint Mr William Wates and Edward Thomas &  
 my son Thomas Farewell full and whole Executors of  
 this my last Will and Testament And I do hereby disannul  
 & make void all other Wills either by word of mouth or in  
 writing: In Witness whereof I the said Henry Farewell  
 to this my last will have set my hand and seal this nineteenth  
 day of January anno: Dom: 1726
