Bond of Gibbes to Samuel Penhallow

I know all Men By these presents That I Henry Gibbs
 Late of the Office of 1st Justice in the Island of Barbados Esq^r. But now
 residing in Charlestown in the Province of S^c Carolina am led &
 firmly bound unto Samuel Penhallow Master & Comm^r of the Ship
 Royal Gally to Edward Nicholls & Henry Bullard both of the Island of
 Barbados Agents & Merchants in the Sum of three Thousand pounds &
 Good money of Great Britain to be paid to the said Samuel Penhallow

Benjamin Bullard, or either of them their or either of their Executors, Administrators or assigns was to the said payment well & truly to be made I bind
 my self my Heirs, Executors & Administrators jointly by these presents sealed to my
 Seal to date the Twentieth day of October in the Year of Our said One
 Thousand seven hundred & Twenty Six

Whereas the above named Samuel Penhallow being sometime
 in the Month of August last past at the Island of Barbados at his own Ship the
 Royal Gally did before his Departure shew according to the Laws & Usage
 Custom of these Islands become bound & firmly bound together with the
 Edward Nicholls & Henry Bullard jointly & severally unto Henry Gibbs Esq^r
 Governor of the said Island in the private Name of Two Thousand pounds & or
 some such other great Summ of Money there under written That he the said
 Samuel Penhallow should not depart with his People from nor carry off the
 said Island, any Tithe or thereof, Freeman, Servants or Slaves, without a
 Ticket from the Governor or proper for the time being or to that of the
 like Effect as in & by the said Bond & Condition given & remaining in the
 hands of the said Governor in the Island of Barbados aforesaid & which the said
 Gibbs & Nicholls & Bullard more fully & at large appear. And Whereas the said
 Henry Gibbs sometime in the Month of August last past did come aboard
 the said Samuel Penhallow to transport himself in the said Ship, the said Gibbs
 Gally from Barbados aforesaid to the Province of S^c Carolina with fifty
 Negro Slaves without obtaining from the said Governor or Secretary of the
 said Island for his aforesaid goods & Luggage a Ticket or Tickets as
 or are required to be given by the Laws & Customs of the said Island aforesaid
 By reason whereof the said Bond hath been since put in suit by the said
 Edwards Nicholls & Henry Bullard or one of them, or all of them to be, &
 the said Samuel Penhallow is a Negro Subject & liable to the Penalty thereof
 to be levied against him by the said Governor or Secretary of the said Island
 as aforesaid. And Whereas the Conditions of this Bond are such that if the
 said Henry Gibbs & Nicholls & Bullard or one of them do not make from time to
 time & at all times hereafter well & truly have & keep & indemnify the said
 Samuel Penhallow Edward Nicholls & Henry Bullard or any of them their
 either of their Heirs, Executors & Administrators, Lads & Servants Goods & Chattels
 of & from the payment of the said Sum of Two Thousand pounds & or
 some such other great Sum of Money & of & from all Suits, Costs, Charges, Damages & Expenses
 whatsoever which they the said Samuel Penhallow, Edwards Nicholls & Henry Bullard
 or any of them have hitherto sustained, & shall justly & lawfully or may bear, suffer,
 sustain or be put unto, on account of the said Bond not having obtained Legal &
 Regular Ticket or Tickets for himself & Slaves as aforesaid & of & from all other
 Bonds
