 soever within the said Province of South Carolina, Giving
 and granting unto my said Attorney by these presents my full
 and whole power strength & Authority in and about the Premises
 To have use and take all Lawfull ways and means in my Name
 for the Recovery thereof and upon the Receipts of any such
 debts, dues or Sums of money aforesaid Acquittance, or other Suffi-
 cient discharges or moneys in my Name to make seal & deliver
 & Generally all and every other Act, thing and things Deceit
 and Deceit in the Law whatsoever Needfull and Necessary to
 be done in the Premises for the Recovery of all or any such debts
 or Sums of money aforesaid for me & in my Name to do Execute
 & Perform as fully, Lawfully and Ample to all intents and
 Purposes as I myself might or could do If I was personally
