Know ye that I the said John Hargrave for and on Consideration of the Sum of five Hundred and Twenty Eight Pounds Current money to me in hand at or before the sealing hereof delivered by Thomas Dymus of Berkeley County a Merchant well and truly paid the Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto the said Thomas Dymus all those my four Negro Slaves named Solomon and Robin together with their Issue and Increase have and to hold the said bargained Premises unto the said Thomas Dymus his Executors Administrators to the only proper use and behoof of the said Thomas Dymus his Executors Administrators for ever and I the said John Hargrave for my Executors and Administrators the said bargained Premises unto the said Thomas Dymus his Executors Administrators in manner aforesaid against all persons whomsoever shall and with covenant forever or defend by these presents provided always now then and upon condition that the said John Hargrave his Executors or Administrators shall and do well and truly pay or Cause to be paid unto the said Thomas Dymus his Executors or Administrators the full and just Sum of five Hundred and Twenty Eight Pounds Current money of South Carolina on or before the first day of March next ensuing the date hereof that the said Bill of Sale and every Clause Article and Sentence herein contained shall have determine and be utterly void and of none effect any thing herein before contained to the contrary thereto in any wise notwithstanding In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Second day of September Anno Domini One thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty Six

Ack one of the Ministers to the within said who being duly sworn on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God faith that he did see the within named John Hargrave sign Seal and as his Act and deed deliver the within deed to the within named Thomas Dymus for the use within mentioned it also that twenty and seven was given of the within named Slaves by the delivery of Robin one of the Slaves within mentioned in the name of the whole
