Bill of Sale of a Negro from John Bayley to Charles Town in Butley County in the Province of South Carolina

Know all men by these presents that I, John Bayley of South Carolina Cordwainer, for and in Consideration of the Sum of two hundred pounds, Current money of the said Province to me in hand well and truly paid before the Executing of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby Acknowledge and certify that I am fully Satisfied have bargained sold & delivered unto Jeremiah Milner of Charles Town in the said Province a certain Merchant One Negro boy named Quash and to hold the said bargained premises unto the said Jeremiah Milner his heirs Executors and assigns for ever and I do hereby for myself my heirs Executors and assigns against the Claims of all persons whatso ever with for ever warrant and defend the said Negro boy Quash unto the said Jeremiah Milner his heirs Executors and assigns by these presents. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the third day of September in the year of our Lords one thousand Seven Hundred Twenty Six

Bill of Sale of a Negro from John Bayley to William Ellis

To all to whom these presents shall be seen or made known I the said John Bayley in the name of South Carolina do hereby certify that I am fully Satisfied have bargained sold & delivered unto the said William Ellis to them and their heirs for ever One Negro

Whose name is James Ellis by his last Will & Testament bearing date the fourth day of August last now James Ellis deceased and I do hereby certify that I am fully Satisfied have bargained sold & delivered unto his Youngest Child named Elizabeth Ellis William Ellis & Thomas Ellis to them and their heirs for ever One Negro

Whose name is by these presents Acknowledged the receipt whereof I do hereby Acknowledge and certify that I am fully Satisfied have bargained sold and in consideration of the Sum of One Hundred and fifty five pounds Current money of the Province aforesaid to me in hand paid unto the said William Ellis to them and their heirs for ever One Negro
