Bill of Sale of a Negro from John Bayley to Charles Town in Butley County in the Province of South Carolina

Know all men by these presents that I, John Bayley of Butley County in the Province of South Carolina, for and in Consideration of the Sum of two hundred pounds, Current money of the said Province to me in hand well and truly paid before me in presence of the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and certify that the said John Bayley and I have bargained, sold and delivered unto Thomas Milner of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Merchant One Negro boy named Quash and to hold the said bargained premises unto the said Thomas Milner his heirs Executors and assigns for ever and I the said John Bayley for myself my heirs Executors and assigns against the Claims of all persons whatso ever with for ever warrant and defend the said Negro boy Quash unto the said Thomas Milner his heirs Executors and assigns by these presents. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the third day of September in the year of our Lords one thousand Seven Hundred Twenty Six

Bill of Sale of a Negro from John Bayley to William Ellis

To all to whom these presents shall be seen or made known I the said John Bayley in the Province of South Carolina do hereby certify that the said John Bayley and I have bargained, sold and delivered unto the said William Ellis his heirs Executors and assigns for ever and I the said John Bayley for myself my heirs Executors and assigns against the Claims of all persons whatso ever with for ever warrant and defend the said Negro boy Quash unto the said William Ellis his heirs Executors and assigns by these presents. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the third day of September in the year of our Lords one thousand Seven Hundred Twenty Six

Whereas the said James Ellis by his last Will & Testament bearing date the fourth day of August last now deceased leaving one son named Thomas Ellis and one daughter named Mary Ellis his youngest children named Elizabeth Ellis William Ellis & Thomas Ellis to them and their heirs for ever One Negro boy named Quash and to be equally divided between the said children as Executors of the said last Testament of the said James Ellis for & in Consideration of the Sum of One Hundred and fifty five pounds Current money of the Province aforesaid to me in hand paid William Ellis of Charles Town in the Province aforesaid

Wherefore by these presents acknowledge the receipt and delivery of the said Negro boy Quash and in and in consideration of the said Sum of One Hundred and fifty five pounds Current money of the Province aforesaid to me in hand paid William Ellis of Charles Town in the Province aforesaid and I the said John Bayley for myself my heirs Executors and assigns against the Claims of all persons whatso ever with for ever warrant and defend the said Negro boy Quash unto the said William Ellis his heirs Executors and assigns by these presents.
