Soult Carolina in Perfect health and sound in mind do  
memory thanks be to god for the same I do make Contain  
Ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner and  
following, that is to say first and foremost I do command my  
to God that gave it, hoping that thro the meritorious death  
of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ that out of his great mercy  
just he will forgive me my sins, and make me happy in his  
kingdom, I command my body to the Earth from whence  
came to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors  
after me, and after my debt and funeral expenses are paid  
I leave and bequeath to my only beloved Brother  
Baptist of Charles Towne in Soult Carolina hours Capes  
all and every Part and Parcell of my estate to payables  
whatsoever to him and his heirs for ever, & further I do hereby  
nominate and appoint in this my last will and Testament  
dear and loving Brother John Baptist of Charles Towne  
and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament and  
in his executors or signers to act and do in all things  
according to the true intent and meaning of this my last will  
I do further by this my last will and Testament above  
relinquish revoke and make void all former wills by me  
at anytime made whatsoever In witness whereof I have  
set my hand to seal this 1st day of May  
May in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven  
hundred and six hundred and twenty six the last  
of this his Majestys Province of South  
Carolina Ordinary of the same
