 Continue in this Province and live to a three years One Hundred &

 Assigns a piece of Land at Cape Fear each Contai-
 ning Six Hundred and Forty Acres One whereof is situate about
 One & one half miles above the said Town & known by the name of the
 said Bluffs The other at Rocky Point
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary a Ring
 I give and bequeath to my said wife Elizabeth Bayly the said Estate
 or where I have belonging or by any manner of means
 Appertaining to the said Estate I hereby make over unto my
 wife Mary & my Son John Bayly Exec. & Administr. of
 this my last will & Testament that do hereby & by a power
 hereby and Disannul all and every other will & Testaments wills
