One of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for Berkeley County, James Sharrick who b. duly sworn upon the Oath of Evangelists declared that he had paid the above sum amounting to One thousand Seven hundred and two pounds & six pence & four farthings for the account of John Smith deceased her late husband.

To all People to whom this present shall come, We William Hall of Brunswick in the Province of South Carolina, Charles Burley of Charles Town in said Province of South Carolina Gentlemen and John Cunningham Esq. of said Town and Province Schoolmaster, on the Majesty of the Independently Liberty James Fulton Esq. Samuel Brown, James Jameson for and by Charles of the Nation mutually read and delivered in the presence of John Fennicke and James Patterson and dated the third day of May 1792 may more fully appear, Having deliberately read and understood the aforesaid Allegations and proofs of both the said Parties and Wittingly as much as in us lay to the said James at this day and good accord, Do by these presents Arbitrate, Award Order, Decree & Judge that the said James Fulton do immediately On demand pay or cause to be paid unto the said Samuel Brown, his Executors Administrators or Assigns the full sum of Two thousand Eight hundred Ninety & Six pence & four farthings being the Balance due to the said Samuel Brown & his Executors Administrators or Assigns as fully appears and the said Charles Burley, James Jameson, and James Brown, shall &c. subscribe as their several Bonds & Seals deliver to each other a General Release in Writing of all the said Parties Interests Causes of Action Bonds Bills Promises Contracts &c. Demands whatsoever which either of them hath may might or in any wise ought to have or against each the other of them by reason of aforesaid or means of any Matter Cause or thing whatsoever from the Beginning of the World to the day of the said last past and in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of Our said George King of Great Britain &c. The Witness whereof We have hereunto set our hands and Seals this Thirtieth day of May Anno Domini 1792.
