& Chattels, and I the said John Evans for my self my heirs
& assigns do covenant and agree by these presents
that the said Maudlin Sawcous her Heirs assigns & assigns
and every of them shall and lawfully may from time to
time and at all Times hereafter peaceably & quietly have
hold possess and enjoy the above said Slaves & their Issue
without the least Suit Claim Trouble Molestation or
Interruption of me the said John Evans my Heirs
