South Carolina

By the Honourable Arthur Middleton
Esq. President & Commander in Chief in and
over the Province of South Carolina

Do all to Whome these presents shall come greeting

Whereas John Catell of the Age of Nineteen years (as he said)

by his Petition made humble Suit unto me That his Uncle Mr John Catell
may be appointed his Guardian for the Reasons in the said Petition
Expressed And the said Peter Catell having accepted the said
Guardianship of the said Infant Sheweth for the better securing
his Estate and for the more careful Maintenance & Education of the said
John Catell, Out of the Trust and Confidence reposed in the Wisdom
Integrity of the said Peter Catell I do hereby Commit the said Infant and
Guardianship of the said John Catell according to his Desire & Trust
Charging him, that he do Maintain him in Manners & Clean Washing
Sodging Schooling Cloathing and such good Education as may be fitting
According to the Circumstances and Interest of the said Infant and also all
Other things as a Guardian by Law may or can doe and a true and
Faithfull Acc^t thereof and what Estate of the said Infant shall come
to his hands He is to Render when he shall be thereunto Required
