hands of any three or four of you into the Secretary's office in Charleston
in order to be recorded on or before the Nineteenth Day of August next
evening

Bmldb. No 97th 49

In the name of God Amen I Miles Rivers of Ashly River
and of the Parish of St. Andrew in South Carolina Planter being as
I body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto almighty
God for his same telling to mind the Mortality of my body at this

appointed for all Men to Die I therefore recommend my soul into the
hand of God who gave it, and my body to be Christianly buried according to the
Discretion of my executors here after named, and as to the Hertly Estate Goods
and Cattels God has been pleased to help me with (after paying my Debts, and
funeral Expences paid and discharged) I give and bequeath the same as follows
Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife Mary one
Negro girl named Claudia to her and her assigns forever, and likewise to be
Delivered to my said wife at the time of my decease, Also I give and do
bequeath unto my said wife all the Land I had by her together with liberty
to dwell in the House and plantation I now live on during the time of her
Widowhood

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas my dwelling house and
plantation and to his heirs and assigns forever, but if he happen to
Die and leave no issue then my Will is the same should go to the child that
my said wife is now with and to its heirs and assigns forever

Item I give and bequeath all the rest of my Estate good and chattels not
here to fore given and bequeathed by me in this my Will to be divided between
my wife and son Thomas viz^r my wife to have the third part

Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint Mr. von Thomas my brother
John Rivers and Mr. Wm. Miles to be Executors of this my last will
Testam^r Revoking, disannulling and making void all other former Wills
and Testam^r Before by me made, Ratifying, allowing this and no other
to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this eighth Day of February in the Thirtieth
Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George over great Britain
France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith anno Domini 1727

his ad'm or assigns do well and truly Pay or cause to be paid unto the above
named David Standish his ad'm or assigns the full and just sum of One
Hundred Twenty Five Pounds Two Shillings in good and Lawfull Money of
South Carolina or as before the first Day of February which will be in the
Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and Twenty Seven & lawfull
Interest for the same from the Date hereof without Fraud or further Delay then
this obligation to be void & of none effect, or else to be remain in full force & virtue

by the said David Standish / A Wch given granted, bargained, sold,
in plain and open Market Delivered, And by these presents to him
freely and absolutely give, grant, bargain sell, and in plain and open
Market Deliver unto the said David Standish his ad'm or assigns, of
One Indian Boy named London, One Bay horse called Robin, and one Black
