Imprimis I Give and Bequeath unto my
Wife Jane if she be Living at the time of my
Decease one third part of all my Negro and Indian
Slaves. Item I Give and Bequeath unto my
Daughter Unity if she be Living at the time of
my Decease all the residue of my Slaves and
other Estate both real and personal whatsoever
& wheresoever Lying and being and to her
Heirs Exors Admors and Assigns for ever.
And in Case my said Wife Jane should happen
to Die before me Then I Do Give Devise and
Bequeath all my Slaves and all other my real
and personal Estate whatsoever to my Daughter
Unity her Heirs Exors Admors and Assigns
for ever. Item in Case my said Daughter
Unity shall happen to Dye before me Leaving
Issue of her Body Lawfully Begotten Living
my said Wife Jane. Then I Give all my
Estate both real and personal whatsoever
Except what is before Given to my said Wife
Jane and to the Eldest Male Issue of my said
Daughter Unity Her Heirs Exors Admors and
Assigns for ever And for want of Male
Issue to the Female Issue of my Daughter
Unity their Heirs Exors Admors and Assigns
for ever. Item in Case my said Daughter
Unity should happen to Die before me without
any Issue Then I Give Devise and bequeath
unto my said Wife One third part of all my
Estate both real and personal And to her Heirs
Exors Admors and Assigns for ever one. Then
