To have and to hold the said Negroes unto the said Joseph M'agg his Ex. adm. and assigns for ever. Provided always nevertheless and upon condition that if the said Peter Johnson Esq. or adm. shall and so well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the aforesaid Joseph M'agg the sum of Five hundred and Seventy one pounds on or before the fifteenth day of February Seventeen hundred and Twenty seven any Deduction or abatement out of the same then these presents and every Article and Sentence herein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void and of none effect any thing herein contained to the contrary hereof in anywise notwithstanding. Henry Gibbs Bill of Sale for a Negro to Richard Splate

South Carolina

To all Christian People to whom these presents shall come Henry Gibbs of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina send greeting. Know Ye that I the said Henry Gibbs for and in Consideration of the sum of One Hundred and Forty pounds Law Money of the said Province to me in hand paid by Mr Richard Splate of the said Town and Province at and before the making and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and myself thereof to be fully satisfied and paid, and thereof and of every part thereof to acquit, discharge and discharge him the said Richard Splate his heirs Executors and assigns forever. I HAVE given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, confirmed and delivered, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey, confirm and deliver unto the said Richard Splate his heirs Executors and assigns forever One Negro Man named Sharper, now in the possession of one the said Henry Gibbs, to have and to hold the said Negro Man named Sharper unto the said Richard Splate his heirs Executors and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of the said Richard Splate his heirs Executors and assigns forever and to no other use intent or purpose whatsoever, and I the said Henry Gibbs do for myself my heirs Executors and assigns Covenant, promise and agree to and with the said Richard Splate that I the said Henry Gibbs the said Negro Man named Sharper unto the said Richard Splate his heirs Executors and assigns will for ever warrant and defend against all persons whatsoever.
