Robert Henrich of Berkeley County & Christ Church Parish in the Province aforesaid Planter being of sound mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner following hereby revoking & making null and void all Wills & Testaments whatsoever formerly by me made.

I give my soul to God my heavenly Father trusting through his spirit by faith in his everlasting & infinite Grace & mercy to enjoy the complete justification of my Person and Eternal Salvation by Jesus Christ his only Son the Lord my Righteousness. In and through whom alone Hoping for a blessed death & resurrection I cheerfully give my body to God Earth to be decently Interred according to the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named.

I will & appoint all my just debts to be paid as soon as possible after my decease.

I give and bequeath to my Dear & well beloved Wife Sarah Henrich my Negro woman named Bess & all her Posterity as also all my Posterity of Male formerly belonging to my wife & in lieu of Male it was sold to Mr Charles W. I also give to my said Wife my Negro man named Sam & all his posterity Whatsoever & these Respective increase for ever to all my said Wife I shall think fit to all intents and purposes Whatsoever.

I order and appoint of thirty pounds Sterling be committed to my loving Brother John Henrich in mortgage in Northumberland for so much advanced by him to my Father when living.

Being in fully conscious of the Sincerity & Prudence of my said beloved Wife & trusting of her very Precarious & uncertain being and bequeath unto her all the Remainder of my real and Personal Estate Whatsoever here or elsewhere and all that may become mine for the future full and singular if improvements of the same. I will and by her my said Wife all or any Part or parcel of my aforesaid real and personal Estate to be sold or otherwise to be disposed of as she alone shall Judge necessary for hereby I make her sole in the management and disposal thereof not doubting of her utmost care and zeal to promote the same with Charitable & Pious works and at her Death to

advance towards & same as much as possible which are
 principally intended & designed hereby
 Lastly I nominate & appoint my dear & beloved Wife Sarah
 Fenwick the sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament
 In Confirmation whereof I set to my hand and seal this eighth day
 of February 1726
