This seventeenth Day of January in the Year of Our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and twenty seven, Samuel Jones of Beatty County in the Province of South Carolina being sick in body but in perfect mind and Memory Thanks be to God therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to Die Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in form and Manner following

I Primum Give and Bequeath to my Well Beloved Wife Dorothy Jones the full Use and Possession of the House I now Live in and the Land thereunto belonging During her Natural Life with all Moveables thereunto belonging During the same time and do bring up and Maintain my son Thomas Jones and my Grand Daughter Mary Ann Smith till the Day of her marrying but in Case her Grand Mother Dies before that time then she shall be brought up by her Ante Wife but in Case she is not brought up with her Grand Mother Dorothy Jones or her Ante Mary Wale then she shall have no Right nor title to a maintenance off or from my Estate

I Item Give and Bequeath to my Well Beloved son Thomas Jones the House and Tract of Land I now Live on Containing three hundred Acres with all my Slaves and all other my moveables whatsoever other the

Water that is to say all the Land and no more and the Rest of my son
Estate to be shared among the Surviving Children of Isaac Water
begot on my Daughter as my Executors shall think fitt
As for all my Other Lands Excepting the tract I have given to my
son Thomas I leave my Executor and Executrix full Power to sell
Dispose of them as they shall think fitt and therewith to pay m
