George Pamphill's oath, as Provoost Marshal

South Carolina

I, I, shall swear that well and truly I shall serve the King  
in the office of the Provoost Marshal of the Province of South Carolina  
and to the King's Profits in all that belongeth to You to do by way  
of service as far forth as you can, I shall truly bear the King's and all the  
belonging to the Crown, so that not a part to decrease or lessen, ne to  
encroach of any of the King's rights or of his franchises, and  
whosoever I shall have knowledge that the King's rights, or the  
rights of the Crown be concealed or withdrawn, be it in Lands, Real  
franchises, charters, or any other thing, I shall do your instructions  
to make them be restored to the King again or to the King's Governor  
and if he may not do it, I shall certify the King or some of his Council  
such as you know, for Captain with day it unto the King, I shall not respire  
the King's debts for any gift or favour where I may raise them without  
great Grievance of the Debtor, I shall truly and righteously treat the  
people of this Province and do right as well to the poor as to the rich  
in all things that belongeth to your office, I shall do no wrong to a  
man, for any gift, promised of goods, for favour nor hate I shall  
contract a man's right, all writs and other process to be conducted by  
me by yourself or Deputy truly serve, and the same return into

Office, and shall not take or leave any other fees than exact of a party  
is allowed you.

South Carolina The last Will and Testament of George Johnson the  
Second of April 1727

Sum of £1000000

In the Name of God I make this Day of April in the Year of our Lord one  
Thousand and Seven Hundred Twenty and Seven, I George Johnson of South  
Carolina in Beaufort County in the Parish of St John Gentl, being sick and weak  
in body, but of perfect mind and Memory, thanks be given to Almighty God  
for the same, do make and Ordain this my Last will & Testament in  
manner and form following: that is to say,

I imp: I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping and especially  
believing by the Precious Death and Merits of our Blessed Lord and Saviour  
Jesus Christ to have and receive full Pardon and Remission of all my sins  
and my Body I commit to the Earth from whence it was taken to be decently  
interred at the Discretion of my Executor herein after Named.

2dly I will that all my just Debts and funeral Charges be first paid & discharged  
3dly I give and bequeath all the remainder of my Estate after my Debts be  
paid, both real and personal, be it of what kind and nature soever  
either in this Province or in any part of the world where it may  
or shall be found more especial that one Tract of Land containing  
Four Hundred and Forty Five Acres be it more or less Buttling and bounding  
to the Southward, to Lands belonging to the Barony called Wetoe, to the  
Eastward, on Lands belonging to the Northward on Lands belonging to  
and to the Westward on Lands belonging to unto
